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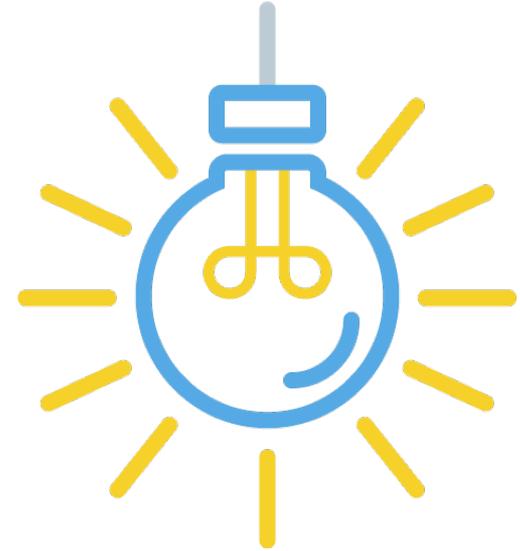

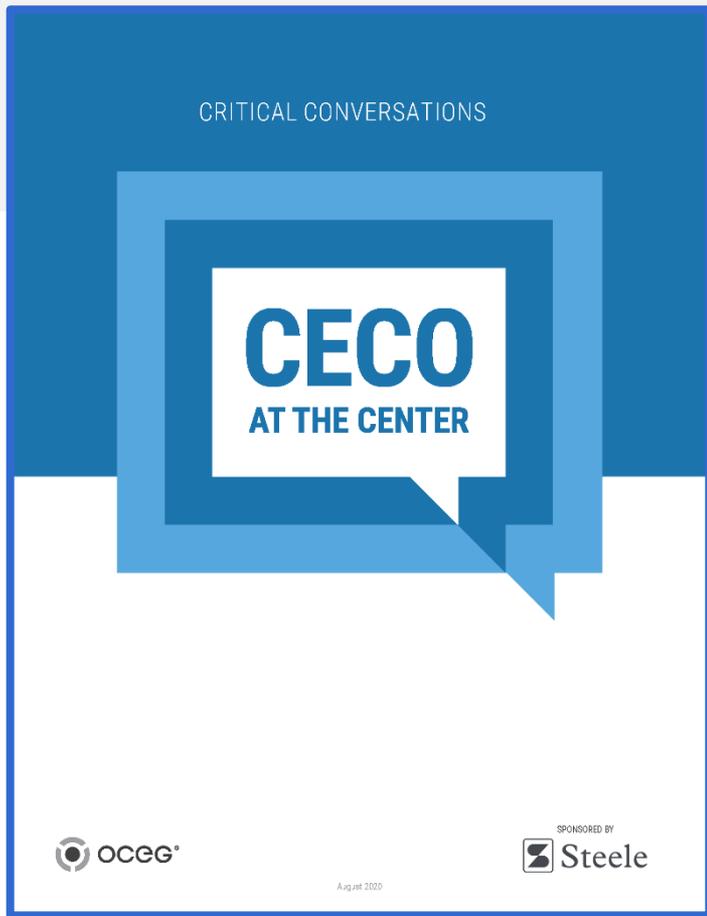

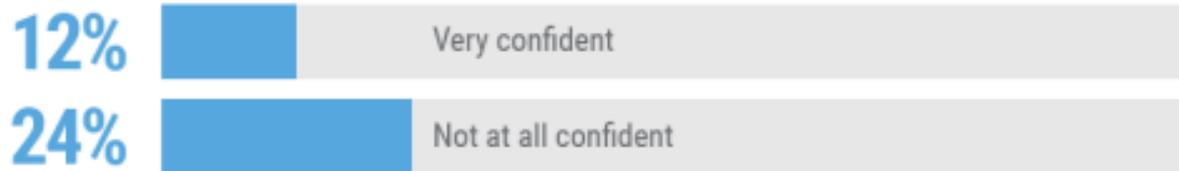

Fully or Substantially Integrated GRC:

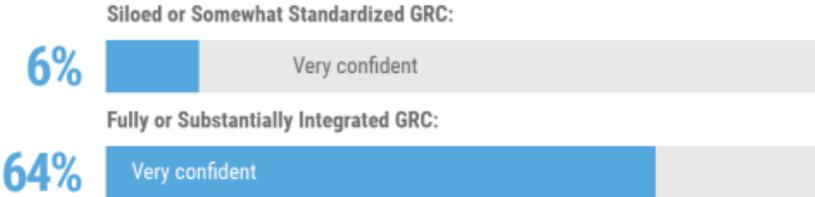


Crisis Readiness is better with Integrated GRC

Conversations with Operational Execs

- **Goals:**
 - More efficiently and effectively identify critical risk and compliance issues in each operation
 - Standardize the approach to GRC to increase value and reduce burden
 - Break down silos through common methods, vocabularies and technologies
- How do you get operational executives and managers excited about improving GRC?
- Does the current pandemic crisis change the way you discuss GRC?

Conversations with the Board

- **Goals:**
 - Improving transparency into top/strategic risks and compliance concerns
 - Gaining confidence, agility and resiliency
 - Protecting against adverse effects of risk and noncompliance
- Is the Board asking CEOs to address these goals?
- How have your reports to the Board or board oversight committee evolved?
- How do you demonstrate the ways that improving GRC will help to meet the desired outcomes?

Conversations with the CEO and CFO

- **Goals:**
 - Getting complete and reliable information and recommendations
 - Improving ability to make well-reasoned, risk-informed decisions
 - Managing risk and resources to improve financial performance
